The City has also created a webpage for the project: https://www.toronto.ca/city-government/planning-development/construction-new-facilities/park-facility-projects/havenbrook-park-improvements/

This website will have a survey available this Fall and has an option for folks to sign up to receive updates on the project.

We know that the project chosen through PB was for additional lighting, and we are in the process of scheduling a site visit with staff to try to move the additional lighting forward.

We've had an eventful summer at City Hall. Our new Mayor Olivia Chow wasted no time getting started and recently announced her official appointments for new leadership roles. I am excited to share that I have taken on the role of Chair of the Budget Committee and Vice-Chair of the Economic & Community Development Committee, where I'll act as the Mayor's Economic Development & Culture Champion. This is a pivotal moment for our city, and I'm ready to get to work on a budget that delivers for residents here in Don Valley North and across the city.

To provide some updates on projects in our own backyard, the Sheppard Avenue East Reconstruction, happening from Bayview Avenue to Leslie Street, will begin next year. City staff held multiple rounds of consultation on this project and heard from hundreds of neighbours. Thanks to this robust consultation process, we have guaranteed two lanes of traffic in each direction, necessary turning lanes, and proper treatments at intersections to make sure all road users can get from point A to point B safely and reliably. Thanks to all of the Henry Farmers who took the time to be a part of this process.

Lastly, I wanted to share an update on the Havenbrook Park playground upgrades that were chosen through the Henry Farm Participatory Budgeting process. I appreciate the community's patience and am excited to announce that community consultation on the proposed playground designs will start this fall. Once the community selects a design, construction is slated for summer 2024. This has been a long time coming, but I'm confident that the upgrades will be worth the wait.

Neighbourhood Watch Report

Construction

As the summer of 2023 is coming to a close, the trucks, dust, and noise continue. But it does seem to be nearing an end on some of our streets. Please remember to say hello and welcome new neighbours as they move into their new homes. A warm welcome to Henry Farm is what we are noted for. Provide Information about our Association, the garbage pickup days, and events we traditionally run in October, such as the Thanksgiving Parade with the Food Drive, and our Halloween plans for a fun day for the children.

Crime Activity and Safety issues

In our neighbourhood, we all express concerns about theft and break-ins. But, if you look at statistics, compared to many other areas of the city, Henry Farm is a very safe and crime free place to live. This is because we take our role seriously in looking out for each other.

Let's try to keep it that way. Let neighbours know when you are away and leave a number where you can be reached if there is a problem with your home/property.

Once again, park cars in your garage, if possible. Lock car doors at all times and make sure there are no items of interest visible through car windows. Don't tempt theft by being careless!

Installation of Security Cameras is a valuable deterrent. If an incident occurs, as it did this month at a home on Havenbrook Blvd., the video can be given to Police to help identify the suspects. The homeowners were alerted by their security cameras, around 5:30 a.m., that someone was attempting to open their front door. Residents should consider getting security cameras installed on your property and be very public about the fact that we have this equipment, in order to deter break-ins. A well-lit property is a great investment in safety and is also a welcoming gesture to walkers, and visitors, as well as neighbours coming home in the evenings.

Report any incidents to the Police and to me as your Police Liaison. It helps to track what is happening and also assists the Police to determine placement of officers.

Gardens

The flowers and shrubs we have all worked on this summer are lovely and it is a great treat to walk our streets and enjoy the gardens. Don't forget to keep the curb and gutter areas free from leaves and grass clippings so that rain doesn't flood the streets.

Toronto Police Information Meeting

At our June 6th meeting, PC Victor Lai, one of our Community Officers from 33 Division, and PC Joel Roberts, Crime Prevention Officer, presented safety information for the Henry Farm neighbours. Their presentation focussed on car thefts, property and neighbourhood safety, phone and internet scams, and traffic on our streets.

PC Roberts offered suggestions to help us protect homes, including lighting and trimmed hedges. He emphasized that making sure your home looks occupied is critical. Always pick up, or have someone assigned to pick up, parcels and mail. Keep your house well-lit and notify neighbours when you will be away and who is caring for your property. It is important to look out for each other and recognize suspicious activity, such as cars and bikes not usually there.

Ways of reporting concerns, from calling 911, to online reporting, were discussed. Even if there is no immediate solution, reporting is critical, so we compile statistics and Police know where to assign officers.

Car thefts were a "hot" issue, and we heard about ways to prevent vehicle thefts by installing alarm systems, vehicle tracking systems, as well as keeping your car out of view as much as possible. With regards to Scams: these people are trying to create a sense of urgency for you to do something. Never send any money online. Call a family member and seek advice.
